Mrs D offered a huge vote of thanks to the East Preston Yarnbombers and said it would be great if the pieces could be auctioned off. Mrs D also offered a vote of thanks to KEPT (Keep East Preston Tidy) and everyone that took part in the recent village tidy-up.

Cllr Linton understood but regretted the need for such an abbreviated agenda for the meeting. In particular, Cllr Linton missed the Clerk's Report.

Cllr McElroy asked if a concern could be passed back to the East Preston Yarnbombers as they have covered up the highvisibility strips on bollards, those strips being there for safety reasons. The Clerk said he would pass this concern on.

Cllr Duff also asked if the current examples of yarnbombing will be auctioned off.

Cllr Gunston advised the Environmental Initiatives Working Party had a proposal it would be bringing to the July Full Council meeting.

Cllr McElroy said the Amenities Committee was already looking at replacing the low-level "dragon's tooth" fencing around the Village Green. This was possibly more urgent following recent incursions on other land in the village. The proposal was to replace the current wooden fencing with recycled plastic fencing which had a life-expectancy of at least 25 years. The committee was also considering how to manage requests for memorial benches when space for such was running out.

Cllr Wilkinson said his grandchildren had been very impressed with the yarnbombing and had wanted to take it all home with them.

Cllr Moore reported he had attended two recent cricket matches, one of which had seen a number of sixes scored, but all had been stopped from leaving the ground by the safety netting.

Final audit
